- SUBJECT + AUXILIARY VERB + NOT + VERB
 + OBJECT
 SAVnotVO
- I do not go to the theatre.

- AUXILIARY VERB + SUBJECT + VERB + OBJECT?
 AVSVO?
- Do you go to the theatre?
