WORD ORDER IN ENGLISH SENTENCES

- In affirmations:
- SUBJECT + PREDICATE (VERB) + OBJECT
SVO
- I go to school.

WORD ORDER IN ENGLISH SENTENCES

- In negative sentences:
- SUBJECT + AUXILIARY VERB + NOT + VERB
+ OBJECT
SAVnotVO
- I do not go to the theatre.

WORD ORDER IN ENGLISH SENTENCES

- In questions:
- AUXILIARY VERB + SUBJECT + VERB + OBJECT?
AVSVO?
- Do you go to the theatre?

- SUBJECT + VERB + direct object + to-INFINITIVE
- I expect her to come.
- I want her to come.

COMPLEX OBJECT

- SUBJECT + VERB + direct object + to-INFINITIVE
- Expect
- Want
- Believe
- Consider
- Find

COMPLEX OBJECT

- SUBJECT + VERB + direct object + bare INFINITIVE
- I make her come.
- I let her come.
- I hear her come.

COMPLEX OBJECT

- SUBJECT + VERB + direct object + bare INFINITIVE
- Make
- Let
- See
- Notice
- Observe
- Feel
- Hear

COMPLEX OBJECT

- SUBJECT + VERB + direct object + Ving
- I see her coming.
- I hear her coming.
