
# Closed Syllables


Consonants close the door so the vowel can NOT say its name. Use the short vowel sound.




When a syllable has one vowel followed by one or more consonants, that vowel will make its short sound.

# Open Syllables

There is no consonant closing this vowel in. Use the long vowel sound.



When a syllable ends with a vowel, that syllable is OPEN, so the vowel can **say its name**.
